Kronebusch, Karl, "Health Interests and Campaign Treasuries: A Portrait of Political Activity in the American States", Writing Results, Scholarly.

Analysis of the distribution of state-level campaign contributions from the health sector, including estimates of the magnitude of these contributions for the sector as a whole and for

various component subsectors. The results show important differences between the different subsectors concerning the approach to campaign contributions, and the choice of the general targets for contributions.

Kronebusch, Karl, "Health-Related Interests and State-Level Campaign Contributions: Trends, Shifting Tides, and Party Mobilization", Writing Results, Scholarly.
Examines data on state-level campaign contributions from the health sector, provides estimates of the relative balance of these contributions towards the two major political parties in the U.S., and analyzes the effects of party-related mobilization on the various components of the health sector. The results show important differences across the subsectors in the partisan composition of the contributions. The analysis also identifies a broader and more dynamic political process, and a greater level of partisan linkage than would be predicted from simply examining the role played by formal interest group organizations or from theories based on the general political economy of the health care and health insurance industries. -- To be submitted, Spring 2019
